100 Black Men of Madison Prostate Cancer Awareness Walk *14 September 2013*



Join the 100 Black Men of Madison for our first **Prostate** Cancer Awareness Walk, Saturday, 14 September 2013.

Prostate cancer forms in tissues of the prostate (a gland in the male reproductive system found below the bladder and in front of the rectum) and usually occurs in older men. The

National Cancer Institute reports that there have been an estimated 238,590 new cases and 29,270 deaths from prostate cancer in the United States so far this year.

According to the Center for Disease Control, prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths among men in the United States. African-American men have higher rates of getting and dying from the disease, although it is still unclear why.

The route will begin at the corner of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. and Wilson Street in downtown Madison, Wisconsin. The walkers will proceed from there, turning right to walk around the Capitol and finish at the steps of the Capitol on the State Street side.

In December of last year, the 100 Black Men of Madison broke news that, as a result of a request for inclusion of people of color and women in City of Madison contracting opportunities, an Amendment to the City of Madison's 2013 budget to conduct a disparity study to determine the feasibility of including Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) firms in Public Works construction projects passed 13 November 2012.

Led by the Economic Development Committee of the 100 Black Men of Madison and a coalition involving Juan Lopez of the Latino Chamber of Commerce of Dane County and Brian Mitchel of the Wisconsin Association of Minority Contractors and backed by Mayor Paul Soglin, this historic Amendment states that a disparity study is necessary to establish a basis to include DBE goal setting in projects not receiving federal assistance.

Through positive and productive work of the 100 Black Men of Madison, Mayor Soglin and his staff, the City of Madison Disparity Study RFP #8258-0-2013/MM was released 15 July 2013, and will remain open to the public until 2:00 p.m., Monday, 26 August 2013.

City of Madison 2007-2012 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) utilization is 5.65%, while DBE utilization (including minority and women-owned businesses) is less than 1% for the same period. Therefore, this disparity study is necessary to establish a basis to include DBE goal setting in projects not receiving federal

financial assistance.
