At this event, one thousand two hundred and forty three (1,243) toys were collected for distribution to needy area youth.

To generate interest, a Corporate Challenge was fused into this year's activity. The first-place winner was the Wisconsin National Guard and second

place went to the employees of the Hilton Monona Terrace Hotel. Other participating organizations were Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, BMO - Harris Bank, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Group Health Cooperative, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Madison Metropolitan Chapter of The Links, and the Madison Metropolitan School District.

During 2010, the Toys for Tots program disseminated more than 54,000 toys to 10,000 families in our area. The 1,243 toys collected at this event are approximately two percent (2%) of the total amount of toys shared with disadvantaged children last year.
